

## Pharmacists Society of the State of New York Elects Dan Bosley as 137<sup>th</sup> President

*Bosley Assumes Leadership of Storied Organization on Heels of Major Victory  
with Passage of Patient Access to Pharmacy Act*

**Albany, NY** – June 15, 2026 – The [Pharmacists Society of the State of New York](#) (PSSNY) has elected Dan Bosley as its 137<sup>th</sup> president. Bosley, a practicing pharmacist and long-time independent pharmacy owner, assumes leadership at a pivotal moment for the organization, just weeks after it secured a historic victory with the passage of the Patient Access to Pharmacy Act in the New York State Legislature.

Established in 1879, PSSNY is the largest pharmacy association in New York State, representing pharmacists and pharmacy owners through its legislative advocacy and providing continuing education and networking opportunities. PSSNY's primary advocacy focus over the last decade has been fighting for legislative and regulatory changes to rein in the powerful prescription drug middlemen known as pharmacy benefit managers (PBMs) that have been raising drug prices, reducing patient access, and driving pharmacies out of business.

Bosley, a registered pharmacist for more than 30 years, brings to the position a firsthand understanding of the challenges facing the pharmacy profession. In 2025, abusive PBM practices forced him to close his two community pharmacies – Keesville Pharmacy in Keesville, NY and Cornerstone Drug & Gift in Rouses Point, NY – after 25 years of ownership. He continues to practice pharmacy as a supervising pharmacist at Kinney Drugs in Malone, NY.

“New York pharmacists understand the incredible challenges the industry is facing and the importance of this moment in confronting them,” said Kelly McMahon, executive director of PSSNY. “That is why they elected Dan – he has lived those challenges and understands what his fellow pharmacists are going through, and there is no one better suited to lead the fight for the future of this profession right now.”

“Pharmacy is more than a business; it's a calling,” said Bosley. “I am committed to fighting for the future of pharmacy and for the patients who rely on us, and I am deeply honored that my fellow pharmacists have entrusted me with this mission that I take so seriously.”

Bosley is the 2026 recipient of the [National Community Pharmacy Association](#) (NCPA) Leadership Award, the 2024 recipient of the [APhA Foundation/NASPA](#) Bowl of Hygeia Award, and the 2020 recipient of the NCPA NICE Award for pharmacy innovation. He graduated in 1993 from the Albany College of Pharmacy.

“Dan has been a fierce advocate not only for the pharmacy profession, but for our patients, and I can think of no one better to lead us as we embark on this next chapter,” said Parthiv Shah, immediate past president of PSSNY. “New York is fortunate to have a deep bench of pharmacists who are committed to fighting for our communities and for each other, and Dan represents the best of us.”
